### About NEHODS

Diagnosing haematological malignancies can be a complex process. The WHO classification of haematological malignancy lists over 150 different types of cancers affecting the haematological system. For this reason, consultant haematologists and histopathologists use a variety of laboratory techniques to ensure patients are diagnosed and monitored appropriately. Integrating these

# New Haematopathology codes compilation

We are in the process of reviewing all of the diagnostic codes pertaining to haematopathology within the LIMS and HaemoSys. The codes are visible at the top of the HaemoSys report when the case is published. With two classifications to deal with (ICC and WHO HAEMv5) it is a large job to ensure we have encompassed everything so we are able to collect accurate data on the diseases we are diagnosing.

Following this our IT team will be in touch with all laboratories where HaemoSys feeds into the LIMS to ensure the codes match in each LIMS before we go live. In the past this has happened over a weekend to ensure minimal disruption but we will be in touch to confirm details in the near future.



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

### NGS – ALL, Lymphoid


In light of the increasing interest and importance of testing for small somatic variants in acute lymphoblastic leukaemia we are pleased to announce that we will be introducing a next generation sequencing panel for all patients with ALL. This will be in addition to the current strategy or FISH and SNP array. RNA fusion panel will continue to be performed in selected cases where required. The first results will be appearing this week will be similar to current myeloid NGS reports.



### **Bionano Project Update**

The Bionano Stratys instrument has been successfully set up in Newcastle Genetics this week. The Saphyr is a high throughput Optical Genome Mapping (OGM) device which promises to be able to streamline Cytogenetic testing and improve reporting times. In the next few weeks we will be starting the Newcastle Hospitals Charity funded AML OGM project to test this novel approach against existing FISH and karyotyping in real time for AML samples across the NEHODS region. Beth and Grace from the Genetics team are to be trained in the new technique and we hope to have our first results in the next few weeks. Updates on this important project will follow.

### Lyrics in Flow


Validation of our new BD FACS Lyric flow cytometer is almost complete.
